Hence, in case of complaints, CARA directs the State Government for inspection/ investigation after which appropriate remedial action is taken by the registering authority i.e. the State Government. However, during the year 2018-2019, 91 adoption agencies have been inspected/ visited by CARA and MWCD officials across the country for monitoring their functioning, apart from inspection at the State level the mandated under JJ Act, 2015, JJ Model Rules, 2016 and Adoption Regulations, 2017 (Annexure-VI)
